My dear Len,

I should really
have answered your Airmail before
this - it was very nice indeed
of you to look Bent up and
write me.

The last two weeks have
been to me a nightmare. I am
having my plate glass replaced,
and believe me I am sick and tired
of workmen and their mess. I have
had no shop front for at least
ten days - this hold up of
course is due to the bombing -

the point has moved anything between $\frac{1}{8}$ " to 3" — properly report the calculations of the glaziers. However to-morrow (with luck) should see the glass in and finished.

To-day the weather is lovely really hot and a cloudless sky — so we can add one more day to our Summer — makes about four in all.

This is my first attempt at writing you — please do not be too critical — I will probably improve with a further effort. It is most difficult when writing abroad to know just what will be interesting to the receiver.

I saw a shocking show last night "show Bent" at the "stall" — at half time I walked out - bored almost to tears, but a little scotch and good company soon made up for the bad start. You certainly have not missed anything there. No doubt you will remember the picture — that was marvellous.

Well I see that somehow or another I have covered my space — probably you are thinking it's a good job the Air letters are not 6 pages long!

Thanks once again for your news and for your visit to Bent — perhaps next time you will be able to spend the evening together. Goodbye love Mami.
